



SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

In interpreting the code please bear in mind the spirit it seeks to capture: our intention is to help students understand the expectations they are likely to encounter in the world of work; also, to help establish a professional tone in the Sixth Form Centre conducive to academic study.

MALE

Formal shoes – not trainers

Smart tailored trousers

Collared formal shirt

Optional:

Jacket

Tie

Plain V-neck jumper

Smart cardigan

FEMALE

Formal shoes – not trainers

Smart tailored trousers / skirt / dress

Shirt or smart top

Optional:

Jacket

Smart jumper

Smart cardigan

NB All make-up, jewellery, hairstyles and accessories should be in keeping with the ethos of the dress code.

Our research suggests that a business wear dress code is well understood by all. However, should you be uncertain please ask a member of staff for guidance.

The following items are examples of clothing that will not fall within the dress code:

Canvas trousers or 'chinos'

Leggings or jeggings

Denim clothing

Sheer material

Cropped tops or trousers

Mini-skirts

Shorts

Sleeveless tops, e.g. vest tops/ tube like tops

Polo-shirts

T-shirts

Converse shoes

Trainers of any kind

Sandals / flip flops

Students who are taking practical subjects must wear the school branded PE kit and are only allowed to wear the kit at the start of the school day if their practical lesson is during period one. Students must subsequently change into smart clothing for classroom based lessons. Any student who does not adhere to the dress code, will be asked to go home and change into more appropriate clothing.
