

We are looking forward to welcoming you into school on Thursday evening. To ensure that all visitors, students and staff feel confident and, as far as reasonably possible, Covid safe, we would ask you to please be aware of the following points:

Do not attend the open event if you are displaying any of the 3  
**symptoms of Covid 19**

1. a **high temperature** – you are hot to touch on your chest or back
2. a **new continuous cough** – you have been coughing a lot for more than an hour, you have had 3 coughing episodes in the last 24 hours or your usual cough is worse than usual
3. a **loss or change to your sense of smell** – you have noticed that you cannot smell or taste anything or things smell or taste different to normal.

- **Hand sanitiser** will be available in every classroom and throughout the school – please use this frequently and understand that whilst our welcome is warm and sincere, school staff will refrain from shaking hands.
- As the school site is likely to be busy, please wear a **face covering** – disposable masks will be available to you and your family at the entrance.
- The Headteacher talks have been pre-booked to ensure that the hall is **not overcrowded**. If you have not managed to book a seat in one of the four talks, we will be streaming the talks on the official Neston High school Facebook book page Facebook.com/nestonhighschool and will also put a recording onto the school website on Friday.
- All corridors, classrooms and spaces will have windows and doors open to ensure adequate **ventilation**
- Please be conscious and courteous of **social distance** demonstrating patience in the event of queues at reception points or bottle necks around school tours
- Student Guides will lead tours according to these established routes and follow our **one-way system**.
- School staff have considered a balance of interactive activities to engage young people visiting the school, as well as creating the opportunity to connect with you and share the essence of the curriculum in each subject. Children taking part in interactive activities is entirely **at your discretion** and staff may choose to lead conversations from behind a desk and / or wearing a face covering
